




A series of layers take one away from the hustle and bustle of the outside to the cocoon of one's home

The housing project seeks to serve as a home where one can let go and be themselves




Building cluster as a layer to seperate the inside from outside

GROUND LEVEL PLAN






TYPICAL FLOOR PLAN

TERRACE PLAN








### THE WALLS OF THE HOME

The house is imagined as a protected shelter, interpreted by thickening its outer walls, though not literally.


The turning of the walls and cutouts within it, create niches, lofts and provide light and shadow, and volumetric variation across spaces





# CONNECTION BETWEEN BASEMENT AND GROUND LEVEL

At the site level, the section shows the cutouts in the ground floor slab, that allow for light and ventilation into the basement.

The position of tree on the way between basement and ground level provides a pleasant experience of walking under the shade instead of directly meeting the glare of the scorching sun.






